- 6. Pastor Andrew says, "Having the goodness of the good Shepherd doesn't mean the absence of trial and testing, crisis and challenge, but the presence of the good shepherd while walking through the shadow of the valley of death, having all the necessary resource one needs to achieve the life God intended."
