# PRACTICAL GUIDE SHEET FOR **SERVICE**

If you want to be great, be a great servant. As Jesus says, *“Whoever wants to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all.”* (Matthew 10:43-44)

Like no other practice, service helps us to develop Christ-like humility.

Below are some ways you can engage in service.<sup>1</sup>

## **ALLOW YOURSELF TO BE SERVED**

Has someone ever tried to do something for you and you refused? Have you taken the time to think about why? Part of growing in service is allowing others to serve us without thinking we have to pay it back. That’s the beauty of the kingdom. It’s a give and take where no one is always in charge, no one is always the giver or the receiver. We’re serving and being served. It’s a divine dance that helps us grow in Christ-like humility.

## **THE SERVICE OF LISTENING**

How many people are going through something and would love to have someone simply listen to them? We don’t need to be trained psychoanalysts to be good listeners. All we need are compassion, patience and the discipline to speak less (James 1:19).

## **THE SERVICE OF BURDEN-BEARING**

Scripture calls us to fulfill the law of Christ by bearing each other’s burdens (Galatians 6:2). Chances are, you know someone who is burdened—going through a difficult time. Ask God, *“How can I help bear some of this person’s burden?”* As well, ask the person in need how you can best serve them. See how the Holy Spirit leads, and follow through with actions. You may be led to pray, deliver a meal, give a ride, keep someone company or any number of things.

You don’t have to be responsible for the entirety of their burden. Do what you can, and commit the remainder of the person’s burden to Jesus. He is strong enough to bear it.

## THE SERVICE OF HIDDENNESS

Cultivate tasks of service that remain generally unknown to others (Matthew 6:1-4). Where possible, serve as secretly as you can, without drawing attention to your acts of service. This undermines pride and helps you grow in Christ-like love, as you truly serve others for their sake, rather than your own.
