THE POINTS FROM THIS WEEK'S MESSAGE WERE:

- Jesus reveals the definitive Truth about God.
- The Holy Spirit guides us into all truth.

LET'S TALK

1. What impacted you the most from this week's message?
2. Many say that we're living in a "Post-Truth" world, which the Oxford dictionary defines as an era where the concept of truth has become unimportant, irrelevant and obsolete. What impact do you think this has on culture and the way we live?
3. Read John 14:6-7, 9b. We often have different pictures of what God is like. What are some pictures of God that you've believed to be true? What do you make of the idea that Jesus reveals what God is really like?
4. In his message Pastor Steve lists some of the lies that Satan tells us about God:
 - a. Lies that God isn't real, or if he is, he isn't good.
 - b. Lies that God doesn't love you, that he doesn't care.
 - c. Lies that God is so, so disappointed in you, and has written you off.
 - d. Lies that God's an angry, vindictive tyrant who takes sick delight in condemning people.
 - e. Lies that God cannot be trusted, and therefore you're better off taking your destiny into your own hands.

Have you ever believed any of these lies? Which are you most tempted to believe?

5. Pastor Steve quotes Tim Keller who says, "To be fully known and truly loved... is what we need more than anything. It liberates us from pretense, humbles us out of our self-righteousness, and fortifies us for any difficulty life can throw at us." What would it look like to really know that you are both known by God and loved by him?
6. What is one truth about God that you need to hold on to this week?
