Biblical thanksgiving isn't based on our circumstances. It's based on the conviction that God is a good God.


3 Reasons You Can Be Thankful In All Circumstances

- 7. Pastor Jeremy says, "The Bible says that one day Jesus will return. And when he comes, he'll judge
