- Justice is what happens in the world when we love God and love others.
- Shalom (Flourishing), Mishpat (Justice), and Tsedaqah (Righteousness).
- In Jesus, God not only sent hope and love into the world, He gave us a blueprint on how to live justly, care for others, and humbly love those around us.
- We do not want justice to just be something we do, we want it to be a point of transformation that comes into our hearts, our church, our community, and our culture.
- Compassion is not just an emotion, it is a call to action, the beginning of mission.
- Where is God nudging you?
- What's in your hands?
- Don't be a hero.
- Don't go alone.

6. What do you think it would look like if the life of Jesus became the blueprint for biblical justice in your own life? In the life of the church?
