- 1. What impacted you the most from this week's message?
- 2. During this pandemic, has your life become busier or slower? What has been your favourite way to distract yourself?
- 3. Pastor Steve says, "It's very easy for confessing Christians, like most of us, to pretty much let Jesus and his priorities get crowded right out of our lives. We may call Jesus Lord and Master, but the reality is that far too many of us leave precious little space for Jesus in our hearts and minds, in our routines and schedules, in our work and relationships."

How do these words speak to you? How do they challenge you?


4. Read *Revelation* 3:15-16, 19-20. Would you describe your faith as hot, cold or lukewarm?

It's easy for Christians to feel guilty when they're not actively living out their faith. But Jesus doesn't your religious performance, he wants YOU and to spend time with you (v. 20). How does that change your spiritual motivation?

We make space for Jesus and spend time with him in our daily and weekly rhythms – through practices like prayer, scripture reflection, Sunday worship, and fellowship with other believers. Which one of these practices do you gravitate towards? Which one would you like to grow in?

5. Pastor Steve says, "Self-sacrificial Christ-like love is the whole ball game. It's the all-or-nothing of the Christian life. If we don't get love right, there's nothing else worth getting right." Do you agree with this statement? Do you think most people would define the Christian life this way?
