LET'S TALK

1. What impacted you the most from this week's message?
2. What do you do, feel, or think when going through a rough time?
3. Read Hebrews 12:1-3. Why do you think the author uses the image of a race to describe the life of a follower of Jesus? Does that image resonate with you? What other image might you use to describe it?
4. In his message Pastor Andrew gives a list of wise choices that can help us run our race. They are:
 - a. Faithfulness, not speed.
 - b. Obedience, not convenience.
 - c. Generosity, not hoarding.
 - d. Sacrifice, not comfort.
 - e. People, not project.

What situation are you going through now that needs God's wisdom? Which of these choices speaks to you the most?

Pastor Andrew quotes authors Len Sweet & Frank Viola who write, *“The entire Scriptures ... are unified by a common narrative ... telling the story of God's interactions, intersections, and interventions with humanity through the life of Jesus ... the thread that holds all Scripture together. He is the prism that breaks forth its multifaceted colors ... the lens that puts all of it into focus, the switch that sheds light on its dimly lit quarters, and the key that unlocks its meaning and richness ...”* How can an understanding of the centrality of Jesus in the scriptures influence our understanding of them?
