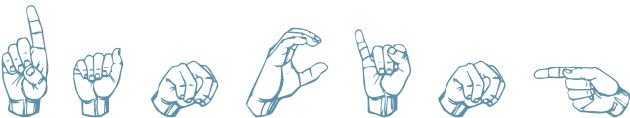
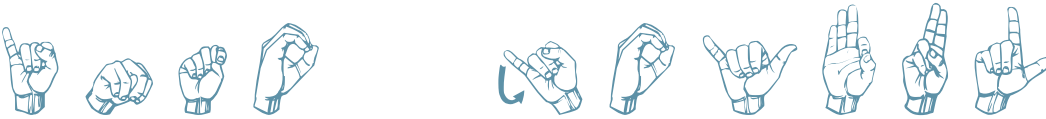
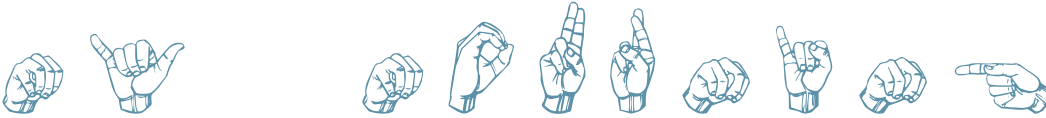
Think-about-it!
