This relationship begins with personal acceptance of the saving work of Christ, followed by baptism as a believer, and is nurtured through ongoing spiritual disciplines.

**CONNECTED:** Disciples honour God's call to participate in Christian community. For this reason, Christ-followers are committed to relational connection in a small group, class, or team of believers for the purpose of mutual encouragement, support, accountability and serving together.

3. Are you currently connected to a group or team of believers at Cornerstone for the purposes of growth, loving support and accountability? If not, do you intend to connect with some type of group in the near future?

1 While we respect the religious heritage of those who have been baptized as infants, we believe that the Scripture teaches baptism should come after one has personally received Christ. While not a requirement for membership, we prefer that a person be baptized as a believer by his or her own choice before becoming a member of Cornerstone. (Your baptism does not need to have occurred at Cornerstone, though.) If you have not been baptized since you became a Christian, we encourage you do so at an upcoming baptism service.

4. Are you willing to commit to biblical patterns of conflict resolution (see Romans 12:18; Matthew 18:15-17), diligently doing what you can to pursue peace and reconciliation wherever needed in your relationships in church, family, work and elsewhere?

**CONTAGIOUS:** Disciples seek to extend the love and grace they've received from God to others through sharing their faith, inviting the unchurched to church services and events, and participating in the church's various outreach ministries to the community and the world.

5. With God's help, are you willing to develop further in reaching out to others with God's love and truth regardless of where you are in this area presently?

**CONTRIBUTING:** Disciples discover, develop and deploy their unique, God-given spiritual gifts to serve others and further the ministry of the church. Through a lifestyle of good financial stewardship, they also build God's kingdom by the practice of regular tithing and offering.

2 Note: "The tithe" is 10% of one's gross income given back to God. It is the standard measure of giving throughout biblical history, and therefore we believe that as followers of Jesus we should aim to adopt at least this standard. In response to the incredible sacrifice of Jesus Christ who left the glories of heaven to become a human being and die on a cross for us (Philippians 2:5-11), we ask that Cornerstone's participating members support this church with their tithes. We realize that for some, tithing will be a goal to work toward over time, and for others it is already a benchmark they can maintain and even surpass as God leads.

**CELEBRATING:** Disciples give priority to the corporate gatherings of the church for the purposes of worship, receiving biblical teaching, and participating in the sacrament of communion.
