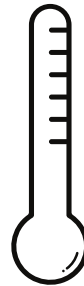

1. Meet prophet Jeremiah. He warned the people about God's judgement and lived through the fall of Jerusalem. His ministry was 40 years.

2. Jeremiah shared God's message of hope: God is making a New covenant that will bring us into a deeper and closer relationship with Him.

3. Meet the prophet Ezekiel. He was taken into captivity with the Israelites. During this time God gave him a powerful vision.

4. The vision: Ezekiel is standing in a valley filled with dry bones. Just like the Israelites, the bones are scattered, lifeless, and without hope.

5. God helps the bones to come together by breathing life into them and they stand up and become a great army. God can bring life to what seems dead, he will give us a New Heart and New Spirit.

6. Meet Isaiah. Isaiah lived during the exile. He prophesied that they would suffer if they didn't turn back to God. BUT through a Suffering Servant there would be restoration in their hearts and the welcoming of a new era.

7. This era will be filled with healing, hope, justice, righteousness, transformation and restoration.
